Intravenous Fluids

Intravenous fluids given during surgery are strongly recommended for every pet undergoing anesthesia, especially our older pets. IV fluids help maintain normal blood pressure, correct dehydration from being fasted, increase the metabolism and excretion of the anesthetics by the kidneys, and provide rapid administration of lifesaving drugs should be an emergency situation develop. The cost of IV fluids is \$35.00.

Pain Management

Any surgical procedure carries with it the unfortunate side effect of dental discomfort. We now believe that pets experience pain to a much higher degree than we originally thought. Medication to control pain is available and can be sent home after surgery with your pet if you so desire. The cost of this medication will vary according to your pet's weight; however the cost of an average 30lb dog would be \$35.00. Would you like for your pet to go home after surgery with a prescription pain medication?

Microchip ID System

While your pet is under anesthesia, we can implant a small microchip under the skin between the shoulder blades. The chip is encoded with a unique identification number and will require only that you call or go online to enter your information and emergency contact information in the database. The procedure is safe and the microchip is not visible under the skin. The cost of the microchip implantation is \$55.00.

Dental Cleanings and Extractions

During the course of a routine dental cleaning, it is often found that some teeth need to be extracted. If the doctor determines that your pet has teeth that should be pulled, do you consent to having this done? Extractions range from \$5-\$50 per tooth, depending on the location of the tooth. If you wish to be called with an estimate first, please be available to answer your phone as your pet will be under anesthesia and prolonging anesthesia time while waiting for a client to call back can be detrimental to your pet's health.
